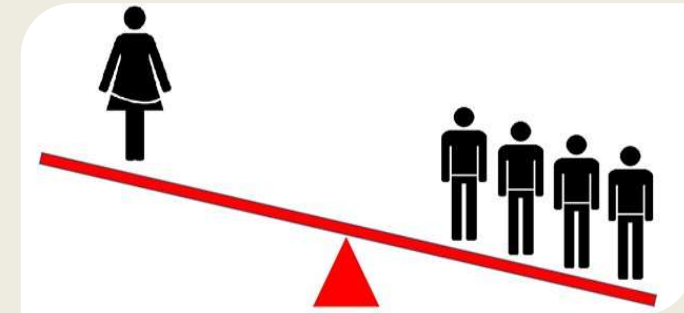

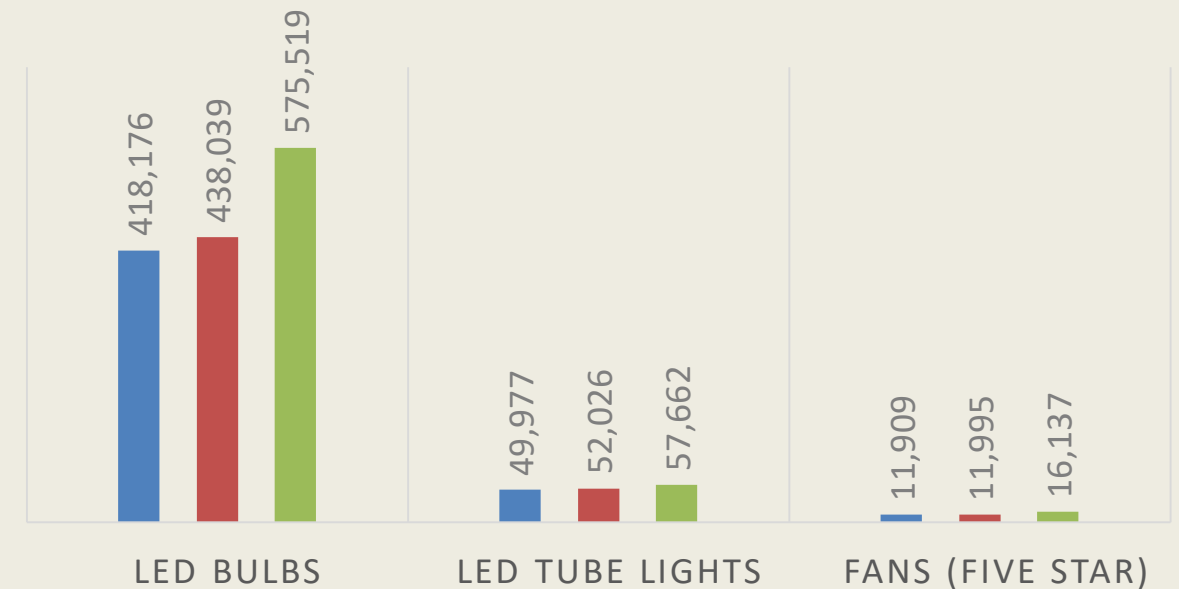

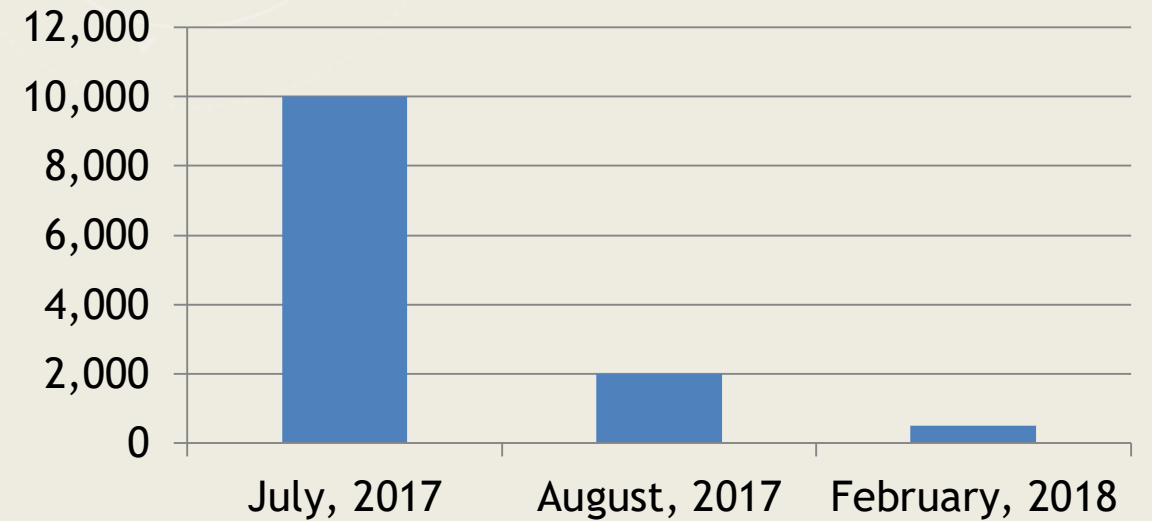

Cash acceptance limit reduced from ***Rs. 10,000 in July, 2017 to Rs. 2,000 in August, 2017 and further Rs. 1,000 in February, 2018*** which resulted in percentage of Cashless transactions increase from 9.15% to 45.35%.
